HIGH SCHOOL ENROLMENT FORM FOR YEAR 7 2019

For our current Year 6 students, the process of enrolling into high school in 2019 has begun. On Tuesday evening as part of the Meet The Teacher information, parents will be provided with their child's personalised *Information Guide and Expression of Interest Form*. These forms are mandatory for the process of enrolment into Year 7 to proceed. Please complete the forms using the information guide and step-by step procedures and return these back to school no later than **Friday 16th March 2018.** If you have any questions about completing the Year 7 enrolment forms, please contact our school.

NORTH ROCK P.S - BUILDING INFRASTRUCTUR PROGRAM

On Thursday, the Program Reference Group (PRG) for the new school building met to consider the three options proposed for our new school building. With a decision required, the PRG have agreed that Option 1 would be the location that would best meet the needs of our school not only in the short term, but with a view to the growth expected over coming years. From this point, the architects will begin preparing detailed designs and concepts for consideration by Department of Education officials, the PRG and the school community.



BRING YOU OWN DEVICE (BYOD) PROGRAM - CORRECT USE OF MESSAGING APPS

It is great to see the rollout of our BYOD program across Years 3-6 positively impacting learning with many children bringing their iPads to class everyday. Of course, this access brings with it some teething issue which we will need to address from time to time. One such issue is access to instant messaging apps. As part of school policy, any communication between parents and their children during school hours must be through our school office. Direct communication between children and parents via an iPad can be problematic as we have had instances of parents arriving at school to collect children without class teachers or the office being aware of any issue. Students have been informed of this matter. However, if your child does contact you via an instant message, can you please contact the school to confirm any issues?

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS AND TERM ACCOUNTS

Copies of invoices for text books and the term's activities will soon be issued. We ask that parents respond to the payment requests promptly as the school must meet the immediate cost of payment for some of these items. The invoice will include an opportunity to make a P&C contribution which the school collects on behalf of the P&C. **Parents should take care when making P&C contributions to indicate whether they wish the contribution to be to the P&C General Fund or to the tax deductible Building Fund where a separate receipt is issued.**

PSSA SPORT FEES ARE NOW OVERDUE

I would like to remind parents that a commitment to PSSA Sport as an extra-curricular activity does include fees to cover bus transport for each season of play. For Summer PSSA sport (Term 1 and Term 4) the fees is \$80. As we are now in the third week of competition, unpaid PSSA fees are now overdue. If you have not already done so, can you please pay these fees immediately as it would be very disappointing for children to be withdrawn from a PSSA squad due to outstanding fees. Your cooperation with this matter is greatly appreciated.

ACADEMIC REPORTS

Thank you to the 127 parents who took the time to complete our survey regarding student reports. The information gained was very valuable as we review reports for 2018. As a result of the survey responses there will be some changes made to our academic reports. Further information regarding the 2018 academic reports will follow in future newsletters. We will also hold information sessions about student reports to help parents understand and get maximum value from these. Summary of survey

On average, parents rated the current academic report 3 stars out of 4 for ease of reading and understanding overall. In providing specific information about English, Mathematics and other Key Learning Areas the results were slightly lower, on average scoring just under 3 out of 4 in these areas. The comments were many and varied, but common themes were that reports need to be written in more 'parent friendly' terms and parents would like more information on 'where to next' and how to achieve improvement. Many parents commented that they appreciate the work that already goes into reports and that they are overall satisfied that the report gives adequate information. There were a few requests for more frequent reports. As stated above, as the year progresses we will hold information sessions to assist parents understand the reporting process and get maximum value from the academic reports.

NRPS News from Year 6 Roving Reporters, Samantha and Julia

On the 20th of February Year 6 had a special day just for them. They turned up to school in mufti to get trained to become leaders. Cameron from Explore Discover Act came to our school to teach us what qualities a leader holds.

THE TELL THEM FROM ME STUDENT FEEDBACK SURVEY

This term our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey aims to help improve student learning outcomes and measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a Tell Them From Me student survey in 2017. Students in Years 4 to 6 will participate in the survey.

Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell Them From Me survey to help improve how they do things at school. I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 12 March and 13 April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

After dinner the captains witnessed an amazing blind guitarist named Lorin Nicolsen who talked to us about what it has been like to be blind and how he was the first blind person to ride his bike from Perth to Sydney in a month. He gave the captains inspiration to fulfil our dreams.

Thursday the captains awoke and got straight into their activities. Alejandra and Liam did the activity called 'The Leap of Faith' Liam described it as "the thrill of a lifetime!" You had to climb up a ten metre pole and jumped off the top, trying to touch a yellow ball, whilst other leaders had to keep you from falling.' Hayley did a different activity called the 'Flying Possum!' it was a trust activity. You were attached to a harness and a pool noodle, and then you were lifted up into the air! Hayley quoted "it was absolutely incredible! But at the same time a bit scary".

Mylen did the 'Power Fan' there was a twenty metre pole, with a fan at the top. There were staples in the pole for you to climb up on. When you reached the top you were told to jump off and were pulled down by a harness. Mylen explained it as "a breath taking experience." After lunch we had another speaker named Cameron come in to talk us about team work and how to learn from mistakes. He had a great influence on us and we learned never to give up! That night after dinner, we had a massive disco, led by the one and only Mr Harker!

Friday morning came around, and the captains had to get packed and ready to leave. But first of all they had one more activity. After breakfast a Jamaican speaker named Marcell came to talk to us about building our public speaking skills. We learned how to be more confident when speaking in front of a crowd.

SCHOOL BANKING

Only a few weeks into our new school year, we have had quite a few new families joining our **Commonwealth**Bank < School Banking Program. Thank you all for supporting our school!

School Banking is on Monday mornings at 8:50 am -- 10:00 am.

Term 1 Dates: 12/02-09/04. (No School Banking on 5th March due to School Swimming Carnival) Term 2 Dates: 07/05- 02/07.

Term 3 & 4 Dates: TBA.

There have been some enquiries in regards to the School Banking and how we run it. Therefore, we think it may be a good idea to share them within our school community.

1. What is School Banking? How do I open an account for my child?

All information is available on Commonwealth Bank website https://www.commbank.com.au/ personal/kids/school-banking.html You can open an account (Youth Saver account) for your child at your local CBA branch or on the

website.

2. What shall my child bring to school on the banking day?

If you have already opened the account for your child, your child should have a bank book which has the account name, account number, BSB/branch name written on the back of the book cover. You may have got a deposit wallet as well. What you need to do on the banking day is:

Fill out the deposit slips (date, account name, account number, student number, and amount of money you deposit). Put the money in one of the wallet pockets (If you don't have a wallet, put the deposit in a plastic bag, label the bag with your child's name, and attach the bag with the bank book so we know whose deposit it is. We will give you a wallet.) Let your child bring the deposit book to the classroom.

3. Why do we need to bring the bank book? Can we just bring a deposit slip?

In order to make sure your money goes to the right account, we always check what's written on the slip against what's on the bank book. We need to stamp and initial both deposit slips; the large one for us to keep and the small one for your record. If your child hasn't banked through us before, we need to assign a unique student number to him/her. This number needs to be written on the de- posit slip every time you bank.

4. Do we need to make a deposit every week?

No, you don't have to. Our school receives a commission with every deposit made through school banking. Therefore, the more you deposit through school the more commissions our school will receive. All the commissions school receives go back to the school and will eventually benefit our school community including your children.

5. Why don't we have the Token Rewards program?

There are only two of us running the school banking at the moment. Both of us have family and one of us has toddler and the other has work commitment. It is already a struggle for us to try to keep weekly banking as regularly as possible. Therefore, we do not have the capacity to keep banking open every single week during the school year, nor do we have the capacity for the Token Rewards program. However, students who bank through the school will receive a small present on the last banking day of term 2 and term 4.

6. Who are School Banking moms? What do you do?

We are the bridge between our school and the bank. Bank likes to call us the "School Banking Coordinators". We are just volunteer moms who have children in our school. We collect and record all the deposits, then enter the deposit amount onto Commonwealth Bank School Banking online system.
