FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

It is pleasing to report that students and staff have settled well into their 2021 class routines. I must make special mention of our new Kindergarten students who have been very quick to understand and settle with the concept of attending school each day and the quality of work I have observed within their classrooms is very impressive. At the end of last year, I shared with staff the Department of Education's priority that "every student is known valued and cared for" and my thoughts and vison around the concept of excellence and the need to have our students striving to improve and succeed. Research has shown that along with high quality teachers, a significant predictor of a child's educational success is the level of expectation his or her teachers have. As such, the school is clearly focussed on ensuring high expectations for excellence underpins all we do and our partnership with the school community in making this a reality is highly valued. Later in this newsletter I have outlined the priorities of our new 2021-24 School Improvement Plan which we hope will bring about transformational change to the quality of the teaching and learning cycle across the school and the levels of achievement for every child. MEET THE TEACHER EVENINGS

Thank you to all parents who attended our first Meet the Teacher session last night and to those who will attend the Year 3-6 Meet the Teacher sessions tonight. We hope the information was both interesting and informative and gave a clear picture of the expectations and programs which are being implemented in all classrooms. If parents have specific student needs or concerns to discuss with the class teacher, I encourage you to please contact the school to make an appointment at a mutually agreeable time.

ROAD SAFETY REMINDER

It is timely to remind the school community of the importance of adhering to all road rules, especially in and around school zones. The tendency for people to double park in Lawndale Avenue when dropping off and collecting students is placing children and others at grave risk if they suddenly move between the two parked cars. This week I spoke with Castle Hill Police who informed me of a car moving off whilst a child was still exiting the vehicle. They have also indicated random patrols around the school will be increased.

Similarly, I ask parents to please ensure children who are riding bikes or scooters to school or anywhere else, do so with a correctly fitting helmet placed on their head. It is staggering to see children on bikes with their helmet hanging from the handle-bars. Having witnessed the tragic results of a car and bike collision some year ago, I cannot force the importance of helmets enough. Please help keep the children safe.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2021-2024

The 2021-24 School Improvement Plan is currently being finalised for publication at the end of Term 1. The Strategic Directions we are taking at North Rocks Public School include;

Student Growth & Attainment

Feedback, Data and Collaborative Practice

Wellbeing, connectedness and Engagement

Within these strategic directions, a number of high-level initiatives are being developed to deliver improvements in learning and wellbeing in order to meet and exceed the targets set for our school.

Through delivery of the school plan it is anticipated that by the end of 2024:

78.5% of students are achieving expected growth in Numeracy and 76.7% are in top two NAPLAN bands

71.9% of students are achieving expected growth in Reading and 79.2% are in top two NAPLAN bands

96.1% of students are attending school greater than 90% of the time.

RESPECTFUL COMMUNICATIONS

Sadly, we recently had an incident whereby a staff member was approached inappropriately by a member of the school community leaving the staff member quite shaken. Thankfully, an apology was received from the person involved, but please remember every individual has a right to expect a safe, respectful workplace and educational facility for their children. Below, I have provided a copy of the Department of Education's School Community Charter which outlines the components of Collaboration, Respect and Communication expected from all members of the school community. Please take a few minutes to read over the charter so all community members adhere to its message and ensure our learning environment is supportive and collaborative.

NEW K-2 PLAYGROUND

Though it has taken almost sixteen months to get to this point, it is wonderful to confirm the new K-2 playground has been completed and is in use daily by the students. They love the mini-soccer field and new goalposts as well as the sandstone walls, seats and stepping stones that meander through the garden. The quality of workmanship delivered by Southern Star Landscaping is exceptional and the final product exceeds all expectations. This playground redevelopment was only possible through the generous support of the North Rocks P&C Association who funded \$100,000 towards the playground and I'm sure it will keep the children entertained and engaged for many years to come.



SCHOOL PHOTOS

School Photos will be held next Monday, 22nd February. This is always an exciting event and all children are asked to wear correct summer school uniform for their photos and though payments have all been made online, children will still need to return their photo envelopes to school on the day. Please be aware family photos are scheduled separately and will take place on Wednesday 23rd February.

PRIMARY ETHICS VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED

The weekly delivery of Special Religious Education and Primary Ethics has a long standing, important place with our school. Over the years, the Ethics program has become particularly well supported with over 100 students wishing to participate in 2021. Unfortunately, there is a significant shortage of volunteers willing to be trained to deliver Ethics and as a result a number of students cannot access the program. In fact, at this point in time we only have two Ethics teachers working within the school. As such, I strongly encourage people who can offer an hour or so each Tuesday morning to consider becoming an Ethics teacher. Full training is offered through the Primary Ethics organisation and I know you will find the experience interesting and very rewarding. 2021 SWIMMING CARNIVAL



NEW KISS & DROP ZONE – DON MOORE RESERVE

Earlier this term the school was advised by Parramatta Council that a new set-down and pick-up area (Kiss & Drop Zone) will be established in the Don Moore Reserve car park to improve safety for our students arriving and departing school. The Parramatta Traffic Committee resolved:

That the angle car parking spaces located on the souths side of Don Moore Reserve car park be restricted with a "No Parking 8am-9:30am and 2:30pm-4pm School Days (12 spaces) and P5Minutes 8am-9:30am and 2:30pm-4pm School Days (5 spaces) restriction as shown in the sketch below.

It is expected new signs will be installed in the next two weeks and I thank the community in advance for complying with these new parking arrangements in the interests of keeping children safe.

SOLVENIC TON

- Aggressive or intimidating language, including the use of obscenities, making sexist, racist or derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- Treating members of the school community differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.
- Inappropriate and time wasting communication.

Does your child have high academic potential? Are they a high

performer?

Each fortnight, members of our Opportunity Class team will share some information about high performing children, along with some tips and activities to engage your child in high potential activities at home.

High potential, gifted or highly gifted?

What do we mean by high potential, gifted and highly gifted students?

High potential students are those whose potential exceeds that of students of the same age. They may benefit from an enriched or extended curriculum and learning opportunities beyond the typical level of their age peers.

Gifted students are those whose potential significantly exceeds that of students of the same age. They typically develop talent and achieve mastery notably faster than their age peers.

Highly gifted students are those whose potential vastly exceeds that of their age peers. Highly gifted students may require specific and significant curriculum adjustments to meet their learning and wellbeing needs.


Actions for Heros

NRPS UNIFORMS

Welcome to all of our new students and families to North Rocks Public School. As we have many new families we felt it was timely to republish our school uniform information. Please see the guidelines below. Our school uniforms can be purchased online through Midford.

Here are the Summer guidelines:

Boys: Grey shorts with blue shirt and grey socks. School sloppy joe, soft-shell jacket or track-suit jacket. Black shoes.

Girls: Summer tunic or summer skort with school blue blouse and navy socks. School sloppy joe, soft-shell jacket or tracksuit jacket. Black shoes.

<u>Sport</u> (K-6)

Boys: Pale blue school polo shirt with royal blue sports shorts or track pants and white socks. **Girls:** Pale blue school polo shirt with royal blue sports shorts or track pants and white socks.

<u>Hat</u>

School hat or school sports cap only

Here are the Winter guidelines:

Boys: Grey long trousers (or shorts) with blue shirt and grey socks. School sloppy joe, soft-shell jacket or tracksuit jacket. Black shoes.

Girls: Winter (checked) tunic or Winter (checked) skort with school blue blouse and navy socks/full tights. School sloppy joe, soft-shell jacket or tracksuit jacket. Black shoes.

<u>Sport</u> (K-6)

Boys: Pale blue school polo shirt with royal blue sports shorts or track pants and white socks. **Girls:** Pale blue school polo shirt with royal blue sports shorts or track pants and white socks.

<u>Hat</u>

Please Note:

- ⇒ Sports uniform should only be worn on Sport's Day. (These will be confirmed at "Meet the Teacher" evenings)
- ⇒ Black school shoes may be leather style or a full black runner (not boots)

- ⇒ Shirts for girls and boys are buttoned and collared (not skivvies – although these can be worn underneath)
- ⇒ Branded tracksuit tops / jackets are not school uniform


